#### Your safety is important

Missions in Haiti can be challenging. Sometimes things don't always go as planned, but the most important thing is to trust that Jesus is in control. By choosing to work with ReachHaiti Ministries, you trust us to make difficult decisions on your behalf. For example: We may have a trip planned into the mountains, but the weather or other circumstances could change. It is possible that we will make the decision to change those plans. These choices can be difficult, but there are times when we must make them for the safety of the team. If a situation arises, we will consult you as the team leader, and do our best to accommodate, but ReachHaiti will make the final decision.





## **Trip Cost Information**

- →\$50 per person per night which includes food, drinks, and housing accommodations
- →If your team desires a day at the beach please let us know while we are planning your trip. (Average cost is around \$40.00 per person which includes a meal.)
- →The cost is \$100 per week for an interpreter (if needed) to stay with us the entire week.
- →This is a trip based on basic evangelism, widow and orphanage ministry in Croix des Bouquets. If your team desires pastor conferences, construction, food distribution, crusades, prison ministry, trips to other places in Haiti, etc., there will be additional costs. Please speak to us directly about what you want to do so we can give you an estimate on the costs.
- →All money is due at least 30 days before your arrival in Haiti.
- →Phone usage: We do have a personal cell phone here that can be used to call the States if emergency arises. We will allow the team leader to call the States once you arrive to notify one person that the team has arrived safely. Please designate one person in the States to call that may then notify all other families of team members.
- →Generally, internet is not available. If there is a specific need, we will try to work it out, but not for general usage. Please discuss with us a specific need before your trip.
- →We block out time for your week which means that we turn other teams down. Please be respectful of this. We are not requiring you to send a deposit simply because we trust you. If you must cancel for reasons such as emergencies or things beyond your control please do so at least 30 days before your arrival.
- →You are responsible for making all of your team travel arrangements to and from your city of departure to and from Port Au Prince. We will have a bus waiting for you upon your arrival at the airport.

The trip cost worksheet will help you in calculating the trip costs. Please ask us any questions you might have.

#### **Travel Information**

## Passport:

A current passport is required to enter Haiti and for reentry into the U.S., Visas are not required. Carry a copy of your passport (separate from your passport and not in checked luggage). Remember to keep the green departure slip given to you in Haiti Immigration. Green Card holders (U.S. Resident aliens) must take their green card; you will not be allowed to leave Haiti without it.

## **Register Your Trip:**

ACS strongly encourages all Americans to register online before departing the United States. Please also fax

- > What is STEP? The Smart Traveler Enrollment Program (STEP) is a free service to allow U.S. citizens and nationals traveling abroad to enroll their trip with the nearest U.S. Embassy or Consulate
- Benefits of Enrolling in STEP
  - ✓ Receive important information from the Embassy about safety conditions in your destination country, helping you make informed decisions about your travel plans.
  - ✓ Help the U.S. Embassy contact you in an emergency, whether natural disaster, civil unrest, or family emergency.
  - ✓ Help family and friends get in touch with you in an emergency.

### **Mission Trip Insurance:**

We recommend that you obtain mission trip insurance. This is not mandatory; however we want you to be aware there is protection available for you and your team in the event of a medical emergency. Many mission insurances also provide options for emergency evacuations as part of the plan. You should discuss with your church or sending agent to see if they have policies already in place. Please research and find the best plan that suits your individual/team needs.

#### **Vaccination Guidelines:**

RHM encourages all team members to obtain recommended vaccinations and preventative medications prior to their mission trip. Remember that some vaccines are given several weeks in advance of travel or you may have to return several times to get all of the vaccinations needed before travel. Most vaccines are available from your primary care provider (PCP) or from a local pharmacy with a prescription from your PCP. Insurance often pays for updating routine vaccines, but may not cover vaccines specific to foreign travel. Please check with your specific insurance provider to be sure. ### WHAT TO BRING

### \* BRING CASH WITH YOU!

- \* There are no places to cash checks or to use credit cards. Cash is a must.\*
- →A set of twin sheets to use while you are there and then leave for the orphanage and mission house
- **→**Pillow
- →Not mandatory but very helpful Portable battery operated camping fan in case we loose power.
- →Towel and washcloths to use while you are there and then leave for the orphanage and mission house
- →We provide toilet paper but if you are sensitive bring a roll or two.
- →A flashlight and/or a headlight with extra batteries
- →Personal toiletries (shampoo, soap, toothbrush, deodorant, etc.)
- →Bug spray
- → Mosquito net
- →Clothing: In respect to the Haitian culture in which we serve, Christian women are expected to wear shirts with sleeves that cover the shoulders & modest skirts or dresses when ministering outside the compound. (No mini's please.) Inside our home and while working at the orphanage, you are free to wear any non-revealing attire you choose. However, when we are outside our home, we ask that you respect the culture and dress appropriately. We also ask that men remove any open body piercings such as earrings, nose-rings, etc. while you are in Haiti. We are not being judgmental by asking this, but please understand that this is in respect of the Haitian culture. You are representing Christ so please dress modestly. Men should also wear pants when ministering outside the compound and no cut off shirts. Inside our home or at the orphanage you may wear shorts.
- → Church clothes: Women- Shirt or blouse with sleeves that cover the shoulders & modest skirts or dress.
- → Church clothes: Men- If preaching, you should wear dress pants or khakis with long sleeves. (Most Haitian pastors wear suit and ties for church.) All other men usually wear kakis with a polo type shirt.
- →Spending money \*\*Just for any personal items or souvenirs you want to purchase while down here\*\*
- →A swimsuit (If we go to the beach or schedule a pool day.)
- →A notebook/journal
- →Your Bible
- →A camera
- →Sunglasses
- →A water bottle
- →Snacks
- →Each team should bring a first aid kit to leave at the mission house.

### **VERY IMPORTANT:**

Please do not give out money or gifts while you are here to anyone without going through the ministry. If you would like to bless someone, we will be glad to pass it through the ministry to them and let them know it was given from you. This helps us create loyalty to the ministry long term. You will hear about many situations in people's lives that will pull on your heart strings, but we can give you some wise advice about these situations.

## **RHM Mission House Rules**

- → Have a Christ like attitude. Be willing to give and take, to maintain the spirit of unity and harmony in the group, and to extend politeness and courtesy to those with whom we come in contact (missionaries, nationals, team leaders, and team members).
- →Be flexible.
- →Please respect the personal space of RHM staff and all missionaries living in the mission house.
- → Missionaries rooms are off limits to all visitors unless otherwise invited.
- → Mission house pool is available only in the event it has been scheduled for use prior to the team's arrival. (Ladies- Modest one piece swimsuit w/shorts. Men- no Speedos PLEASE!)
- →Quiet time is from 11:00pm to 7:00am.
- →Males are not allowed in females' rooms and females are not allowed in males' rooms.
- →Be considerate of others when using bathrooms. Take short showers!
- →No open food or beverages anywhere, except the dining area. (Always clean up after yourself.)
- →In the event items are left out they will be collectively placed into a basket located in the dining room. Costly items such as cell phones or iPods will be place in the lost and found lock box located in the office. (Office manager can retrieve those items for you.)
- →For your safety never leave the compound without prior approval and never without a RHM staff member.
- →Smoking, illegal drugs, or alcohol is strictly prohibited.
- →No foul language.
- →Please do not give gifts or money to anyone without going through the ministry. If you would like to bless someone, we will be glad to pass it through the ministry to them and let them know it was given from you. This helps us create loyalty to the ministry long term.
- →Do not make promises of any kind.
- → Due to cultural considerations, public displays of affection are not acceptable.
- →NEVER wander off or go exploring by yourself.
- →It is important that you dress modestly. Your appearance is important not only for the missionary's reputation, but also because it affects how the local people will perceive you. (See more on dress guidelines in the what to bring section under clothing & church clothes.)
- →Do not give your telephone number to anyone and be cautious when giving your address or e-mail address
- →Be at all meals, even if you don't plan to eat. Announcements often happen there, and it is a good time for fellowship.
- →No pranks! They tend to get out of hand, property gets damaged, and feelings get hurt.
